BUILT FOR LONG-TERM JOINT HEALTH

Arthramid integrates into the joint lining to support elasticity, reduce stress within the joint, and help maintain soundness over time.

This supports improved comfort, movement, and consistency in horses in work.

What to Expect After Treatment

- 48 hours rest immediately after treatment
- Gradual return to work over the following 2 weeks
- Horses typically show progressive improvement over several weeks
- Follow-up assessment recommended at 4–6 weeks

Recovery and return-to-work plans should always be guided by your veterinarian.

ONGOING IMPROVEMENT

Most horses show gradual improvement in comfort and movement over the weeks following treatment, as joint function stabilises and strengthens.

Results vary depending on the horse, joint, and stage of disease.

Treatment Planning

Your veterinarian will determine the appropriate joints, dosage, and timing based on your horse's condition, workload, and stage of disease.

Treatment may involve one or multiple joints, tailored by your veterinarian.

About the Treatment

Arthramid is administered by your veterinarian directly into the joint under sterile conditions.

The procedure is typically completed during a standard veterinary visit and tailored to your horse's individual needs.

Your veterinarian will guide you on timing, suitability, and expected outcomes.
